FRANK:

Ladies and gentlemen, I just got back from one of my favorite churches in America, Calvary Chapel, Chino Hills. And while I was there, I kind of got sick. So, you might hear my voice isn't quite there. It's not quite back yet. In fact, last Wednesday night, Jack Hibbs and I, the pastor, were supposed to do a happening now where he was going to interview me on a book, 'Correct, Not Politically Correct,' a book I wrote back in 2008 and then updated last year.

He actually ordered 7500 books for his church, and he was supposed to interview me, but Jack himself got sick. So, I actually said, Frank, you've just got to do the whole presentation. So, I did 'Correct, Not Politically Correct: About Transgenderism.' And you can see that program on the Calvary Chapel Chino Hills YouTube site. Jack really liked the presentation. He sent it to a lot of influential folks. I'm very blessed to know Jack Hibbs, who is one of my favorite pastors in the country. One of my favorite churches in the country.

Jack is dialed into not only the Bible, but what's going on culturally. And today we're going to get into a little bit more of that, what's going on culturally. Before I do, I want to mention that I know a lot of you have enjoyed the past couple of podcasts with Chip Bennett, Dr. Chip Bennett from Grace Community Church down in Sarasota. Chip has some great insights into the scriptures.

This coming Tuesday, we'll have our third episode with Chip at the Midweek podcast. You don't want to miss that. So, wherever you listen to podcasts, go to the I Don't Have Enough Faith to be an Atheist podcast, and you will see it there. So, look for Chip this Tuesday. Today we're going to talk about a subject that will shock you. It shocked me. I didn't know much about it until I read an advance copy of a book called 'The 1916 Project.'

No, no, not the 1619 propaganda project, but The 1916 Project. And I need to warn you, ladies and gentlemen, if you're listening on the American Family Radio network, this program is going to be PG-13 today and we are going to be correct, not politically correct. We're going to talk

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about some issues you need to know about. And once you know the history, you're going to be shocked. You're going to realize how we got to where we are. What do I mean, how we got to where we are?

Do you want to understand what ideas and individuals brought us? Third trimester abortions, infanticides, euthanasia, pornographic sex-ed, critical race theory, transgenderism, the transient of children, drag queen story hour, arresting pro-life sidewalk counselors, and labeling parents who speak at school board meetings as domestic terrorists. You want to know where all that came from? Well, you can go back to the Garden of Eden, but more, more recently, you can go back to 1916. Why 1916?

Well, my friend, the great Seth Gruber, here he is, ladies and gentlemen, is a pro-life speaker who has written a riveting new book that actually doesn't come out until September. And he's actually also created a video documentary called 'The 1916 Project.' And you're wondering, what could this be? Well, Seth Gruber's going to tell us. Seth, my friend, how are you?

SETH:

Frank, good brother. What a pleasure to share the stage with you recently. Here we go. Got my pastor Alan Jackson coffee mug here. Our time in Nashville.

FRANK:

Yeah, we were in Nashville. Seth and I were in Nashville back in late April. And our friend Alan Jackson, who has a great church there just south of Nashville in Murfreesboro. I think it's called World Outreach.

SETH:

I call him the Jack Hibbs of Nashville. But then the people at his church called Jack Hibbs the Alan Jackson of California. So, you got these warriors everywhere, brother. And, dude, it's awesome to have become friends with you over the last several months. I've been acquainted with you, obviously, for a long time. I used to work at Life Training Institute with Scott Klusendorf. And actually, Scott used to work at the Center for Bioethical Reform with Greg Cunningham, who's my godfather, on whose board my mother sat in the early 90's when the center for Bioethical Reform was founded.

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So, just a lot of fun connections over the years in the culture war. And now here I am at 32 years old, three kids, and I've just kind of been yelling things at the church and the culture. And strangely, brother, people are listening. And I've never seen the church more kind of awakened, eager to act, and actually concerned about what their apathy hath wrought. I think the number one question most believers are asking in America right now is kind of what the heck is going on in America and how did we get here?

That's probably the number one question I get from concerned parents around the country because I'm in about three pulpits a month, is simply like, how did this happen? And the answer is, well, things happen gradually, then suddenly, just like bankruptcy. Okay, you made some bad financial decisions, husband, and you go to your wife, and you say, so we're bankrupt, babe. I don't know how it happened. Your wife would probably say, honey, you've been making bad financial decisions for decades. What do you mean how did this happen?

The same thing, Frank, is true of politics, worldview, culture, and ideologies. They brew under the surface. They grow gradually, and we don't recognize it. And we have this stupid, annoying tendency in America, especially in the church, Frank, where we think that liberty and freedom is perpetual. This is America. Communism would never come to America. Tyranny would never come to America. And we just assume these kinds of things are perpetual. And then the dam breaks open, and we're like, oh, gosh. Drag queen story hour happened really fast. Throwing pro-lifers in jail happened really fast.

Texas Children's Hospital last week, Frank, last week. Oh, they've been lying and breaking Texas state law by reimbursing through Medicaid, transgender surgeries, and hormones on minors after they said that they weren't doing it, breaking the law with 11, 12, and 13 year olds. Wow. Transing the kids happened really fast.

No, no. None of these things happened really fast. And so, I'm sort of a little bit of an intellectual ADD, homeschool kid from Los Angeles who just likes to know as much as I can. And I put that in a book and a movie. It's called 'The 1916 Project,' and the book is called 'The Lying, the Witch, and the War We're In' is the subtitle. And so, thank you for having me on today, brother.

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FRANK:

Yes, well, 1916. We need to start there, Seth, because that is a year that someone by the name of Margaret Sanger opened a clinic in Brooklyn, New York. Take it from there.

SETH:

Yeah, that's right, brother. A lot of people know the name Planned Parenthood. Almost everyone does. It's one of the largest, best funded, and most profitable 501(c)(3)'s in human history. It's the largest abortion provider in the world. It's the largest provider of that pornographic, comprehensive sexuality education in America's public schools. And mom, dad, if you're listening to this right now, mothers, fathers, you seen any videos of angry moms and dads speaking to school board meetings in the last four years? I bet you have.

I bet you've seen many viral clips of angry moms and dads at school board meetings. Why are they there? Because of the obscene, literally. And I don't use, I'm not throwing this word around just to rile people up into a frenzy, Frank. Literally, pornographic sex-ed in the schools. Planned Parenthood, largest provider of what's called comprehensive sexuality education. And as of last year, they are now the second largest provider of cross-sex hormones and puberty blockers for America's gender confused youth.

FRANK:

Hey, Seth, before we go any further. Why in God's name is any federal tax money going to this organization?

SETH:

That's right. Because abortion is not just one issue among many. Abortion is not just a political concern that some people in the Democrat party have and some of the rhino Republicans and, you know, the liberal establishment can shrug their shoulders. It's like maybe I care about it. Maybe not. No, what you have to understand Christian is abortion is the linchpin upon which the liberal establishment swings. It's one of the centerpieces of secularism.

Actually, let me put it this way, Frank. It's the sacrament of the religion of humanism. And here's what I mean by that. Abortion says, you must die so I can live. But Christ says, no. I must

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die so you can live. And so, they use the same words as our savior at the first communion. This is my body.

FRANK:

A lot more with Seth Gruber. We're going to give you his website right after the break. And you're going to want to get dialed in on this. Friends, this is very important for the future of your children, the future of the nation, even partially the future of Christianity. We're back in two minutes. Ladies and gentlemen, when I was speaking at Calvary Chapel, Chino Hills last Wednesday night and last weekend, I was at the book table and a lady came up to me from, I believe, Kansas. She handed me a, I don't know, this thing must be several hundred pages. And it's titled 'Sex and the School Library.'

You won't believe your eyes, a guide for parents. I think it's Moms for Liberty that put this together. And what they did is they went through libraries of elementary schools, and high schools, and middle schools in Johnson County, Kansas. And if this was a show on YouTube, I couldn't show you some of the pictures and some of the pornography that they discovered in these kids' libraries. I couldn't show it to you. It would be a violation of some sort of FCC rule.

And yet this is apparently morally appropriate for kids. How did we get here? Well, our guest today, Seth Gruber, who has put together not only a new book, but a new documentary called 'The 1916 Project,' is going to tell us today. And it's going to be eye-opening and hopefully it's going to motivate you to get involved. Seth let's go back to 1916. What happened?

SETH:

So, Frank, it's this very interesting kind of story about how all this happened. First of all, 1916 is the first Planned Parenthood clinic, okay? It's Margaret Sanger's first clinic, okay? So, that's the evil from which most of today's insanity has been flowing ever since. Let me make a statement, then I'll back it up. Margaret Sanger is very likely the most successful leftist revolutionary activist of the 20th century, meaning there's probably no one else except maybe Kinsey in the 20th century, whose fingerprints, work, and legacy has such an impact on today's insanity. She's been called the patron saint of feminism, Frank.

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I mean, Barack Obama got the Margaret Sanger award, okay? Nancy Pelosi got the Margaret Sanger award. Kamala Harris has been working really hard to get the Margaret Sanger award, but she ain't gonna get that award and here's the reason, Frank, because the revolution always eats their own. And so, this very interesting story happened in the summer of 2020 in the very heated environment of the mostly peaceful, somewhat fiery BLM arsony riot protests, where the liberal establishment and the BLM activists went after their own. And this was a result, actually, of the New York Times 1619 project.

And here's the funny sort of relationship between the 1619 project and my 1916 project, Frank. The 1619 Project very quickly says, America's racist, root and branch. There's nothing redeemable about it. So, that's where we get this idea of systemic racism remember? Well, what does LeBron James say? When black people leave their home, they're being hunted. Yes, I'm sure LeBron James is being hunted when he leaves his home.

And so, Nicole Hannah Jones, the purple-haired Marxist who authored the 1619 project. And I'm not saying that to be, like, a mean Christian that attacks people. She literally has purple hair, and she's literally a Marxist. Okay? She was mentored by Angela Davis, one of the last surviving members of that second generation of Frankfurt School disciples. Remember, the Frankfurt School is where we get critical theory, critical race theory. They leave Frankfurt, Germany, because they're afraid of Hitler. And they bring the Frankfurt School to Columbia University, where the Clintons go.

And then all of those sorts of disciples become tenured professors at American universities and the fathers of the radical hippie movement and radical yippee movement. So, you've got The 1619 Project literally being mentored by actual cultural Marxists. And she says America is racist. And so, our real birthday shouldn't be 1776 as a country. It should be 1619 when the first black slaves come to American shores.

Why should that be America's birthday, Frank? Because it's who we really are. We're so racist and we stink. We're a horrible country. Okay, so then that's nine months before George Floyd. Very interesting. So, did you know the liberals, Frank, started calling that summer of love the burning, the arsony, the riots of 2020. People called them, listen, the 1619 riots. Interesting.

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FRANK:

Wait, let me. Hang on. You said nine months before George Floyd. George Floyd was May of 2020. Are you saying this happened in--

SETH:

The fall of 2019.

FRANK:

2019?

SETH:

Yeah. In the fall of 2019, they released The 1619 Project. Yeah. And so, then it became K-12 curriculum, and it gave the really depressed liberals in Martha's Vineyard something to talk about at cocktail parties. Okay? It's now like a docuseries on Hulu. Okay? And she won a Pulitzer for it. And you had liberal atheist historians writing letters to the Pulitzer board telling them to rescind the Pulitzer because of her historical revisionism. I digress. They call the summer of 2020 the 1619 riots because they're connecting it to saying this is all racism.

So, we're justified in burning, rioting, pillaging and stealing because America is set up to, I guess, deprive black people of equal rights. So then, because the revolution always eats their own, Frank, we get the cancel culture of 2020. Not canceling bad things, canceling good things. Right? And if there's any corporation or company that they could argue was connected to racism in some way, way, way, way back, they said we had to cancel it.

Remember Aunt Jemima? Anything that they said had vestiges of racism had to be canceled. And here's where the rubber meets the road. And here's how I opened my film, 'The 1916 Project,' and my book, 'The 1916 Project: The Lying, the Witch, and the War We're In.' They went after Margaret Sanger. Now, listen, conservative pro-lifers have gone after her for about 100 years, and we've been exposing who she is. Nobody's done better work on this than my mentor and advisor, D. George Grant.

And I'm kind of trying to take his stuff and really present it to the next generation on a silver platter with up-to-date animations in this new film. But people don't really know who this

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woman is. But, you know, the Tucker Carlsons, the Glenn Becks, the Ben Shapiro's, the Dr. George Grants, the Francis Schaeffer's. I mean, they've tried to expose this woman and they carried water for her. The liberal establishment carried water for her, justified her, explained her away. And then pro-abortion leftist Marxists in BLM in 2020, said your founder, Planned Parenthood, was a racist. And they said, you're right.

And the director of the Planned Parenthood Greater New York chapter, Karen Seltzer, she said, we're done making excuses for our founder and the damage that she did to communities of color. They took her name off their mega center, flagship Manhattan, New York Planned Parenthood called the Margaret Sanger Health Center. They renamed the building. They canceled her. And then New York City had a sign on that corner called the Margaret Sanger Square. And they took the sign down.

So, Frank, what's that quote by George Orwell, 1984. Do you remember? He said, those who control the present control the past, and those who control the past control the future. There is a hidden history to the secular moral revolution. Why? Because some of that history of what? Neo-Malthusianism, Darwinism, eugenics, secular progressivism, racism, okay, progressivism, cultural Marxism is really damning. It's really concerning. It does not make today's liberals, who walk in the same political and philosophical tradition as those revolutionaries, look very good.

And if American Christians, and laypeople, and voters started to realize how connected today's progressives are to that same crazy, kooky revolutionaries whose history has been whitewashed, they might start living differently, they might start voting differently, and Christians might start realizing, hey, that's actually false religion. Maybe we should have a prophetic voice of the church engaging what is fundamentally demonic ideologies and principalities.

FRANK:

Let's unpack this, Seth, because obviously there's an inconsistency here. If the left were saying that anything that had any hint of racism needs to be destroyed, why don't they destroy Planned Parenthood? They won't do that. We already know that. Okay, so consistency is not one of their strengths. But the second thing that I want people to understand, and you do this beautifully in your book and your documentary, is Margaret Sanger herself. First of all, she

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believed in eugenics. So, let's start there. What is eugenics? What did she believe in? And what did it have to do with blacks? Why did she want to eradicate black people?

SETH:

That's right. Yeah. She launched the Negro Project in 1939. But Margaret Sanger was a racist. But she wasn't a racist in the way that we think of racism today, Frank. She wasn't a racist in the sense that, like anyone who was black, was a non-person with no rights. She would have been more nuanced than that. She was a eugenicist, which is far more sinister than racism, actually, Frank. Because racism is what? Just discrimination based on melanin. Right? Or skin color. But eugenics can open up, actually, anyone to discrimination because it's based off of genes, or characteristics, or qualities.

Meaning that, like, you could be a black person who's very successful. And if you agree with Margaret Sanger, then she'd like you. But if you were a white person who had a mental disability, a physical disability, low IQ, a history of alcoholism and criminal behavior, Margaret Sanger would have wanted you sterilized and prevent you from having children more than the rich, successful black person who agrees with her.

But because black people have been discriminated against for so long, and because in Sanger's era they tended, unfortunately, because you know, of the history of slavery in America, and this is before blacks had full equality before the law. Right? This is early 1900's. Right? This is way before Civil Rights movement. Okay?

She tended to see that, well, black people tend to be poorer. They tend to have more children, which we, as Christians would say, that's a beautiful thing. And she would say, well, no, see, they're actually kind of some of that human waste that's dragging down society. So, she really had it out for blacks, Slavs, Italians, Jews. Oh, wait, those are all the people that lived in Brownsville, in the Brooklyn area of New York, where she founded her first clinic in 1916.

So, Christian, if you're thinking of, like, Hitler, Mao Zedong, Mussolini, Polpot, Adolf Hitler, when you hear the word eugenics, good job. That's all eugenics. But it always wears a different mask. It always takes a different face. And eugenics came from Francis Galton. He actually coined the term. Well, who was Francis Galton? Well, he was a half-cousin of Charles Darwin.

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Oh, wait, full stop. Apple doesn't fall far from the tree there, Frank. Origin of species, Darwin, it's an animal kingdom. We came from monkeys. So, the strong will survive, and the weak will die. He then reads his cousin's writings, and Galton says, actually, the strong must kill the weak in order to survive. He's the father of eugenics. Galton then mentors people like Havelock Ellis, who is kind of England's Alfred Kinsey. He was a sexual theorist and a real weirdo.

I can't talk about the kind of things he was involved in on your show today, Frank, because of the young listeners. Havelock Ellis began a radical affair with Margaret Sanger when she fled the New York authorities for breaking the law and she went to England. She meets Havelock Ellis. What I'm saying is, there's a direct line of mentorship between the revolutionaries, starting with Darwin to his half-cousin Francis Galton, the father of eugenics, who mentors Havelock Ellis. And Margaret Sanger refers to Havelock Ellis, the Kinsey of England, as the most impactful mentor in her life.

And they would remain mentors until his death. So, we moved awfully quickly from the premise, man is an animal, Darwin, to the strong must kill the weak, Galton, eugenics. Havelock Ellis, weird, crazy, sexual revolutionary stuff, to Sanger, the founder of the largest abortion provider in the world, a child sacrifice funded by the taxpayer through all nine months of pregnancy for any reason or no reason at all.

FRANK:

I remind you, ladies and gentlemen, the subtitle of Darwin's book is 'On the Origin of Species by Means of Natural Selection or the Preservation of Favored Races in the Struggle for Life.' Much more with Seth Gruber right after the break. Don't go anywhere. You're listening to I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist on the American Family Radio network. Back in two.

If you're low on the FM dial looking for National Public Radio, go no further. You're never going to hear this on NPR, an exposé of the founder of Planned Parenthood and what you can do about it. We're talking to Seth Gruber, ladies and gentlemen, on the I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist radio program and podcast. Seth is a wonderful warrior for the pro-life cause. As you can tell, he's a fabulous speaker. He's written a brand-new book that comes out in September that you can pre-order.

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And why don't we get that website out right now so people can go get that? And you're gonna want to get it, friends, because it's not your typical pro-life book where it's just talking about here's how you counter the arguments against the pro-abortion side. This is really a history of where all this came from. Seth, how do people pre-order the book right now and maybe even see the documentary which is out in some churches now?

SETH:

That's right, Frank. Thank you, brother. Yeah. And thank you for the endorsement of my book.

FRANK:

Absolutely, great book.

SETH:

It's called 'The 1916 Project: The Lying, the Witch, and the War We're In.' You can pre-order that book right now at The1916Project.com/book. It also has a companion film. It's a 75 minute, full length documentary. I think the book and the film probably put together the two radical pieces of our culture today, which would be weird, kooky sex stuff and child sacrifice, baby killing, into one project to understand how all this kind of goes together. It's actually the same revolution and you can't understand it, like Schaeffer said, in bits and pieces. And the1916project.com, you can see our screening tour.

So, this film doesn't come out until later this year for the world, and the book doesn't ship until September 4. But you can catch a screening of this at a church near you. Hundreds of churches are signing up to screen this at their church, and I'm doing ten more mega churches between June 20 and the end of August around the country, one of which will be Calvary Chapel, Chino Hills, and many other churches. And don't give your money to baby hating, Christian hating Amazon.

FRANK:

You know, Seth, I hear people saying, you know, if I lived during the Civil War or prior to the Civil War, I would have been against slavery. Or if I lived in Nazi Germany, I'd have stood up against the Nazis. But then you ask them, well, what are you doing now to stand up against

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actual murder of children or the mutilation of children? And I get silence like, what are you doing right now? Why do you think you would have been on the right side of reality, not the right side of history doesn't matter. What matters is reality. Why do you think you would be on God's side in those instances? But right now, you're not doing much now for the obvious immorality that is being conducted today.

And I think one of the reasons for that is, Seth, is that most people act on incentives rather than on what is good, right, and true. If you're incentivized to remain silent because you want to keep your job, or if you're incentivized not to say anything because you don't want to cause any stir, if you're incentivized to just go with the status quo, you'll do that. Most of us will. That's the problem. And what you said, I heard you say this on a different podcast. You said that the best way to try and get people to wake up from their apathy on issues like this is to tell them the history of how we got here and to show them that they've basically been deceived.

SETH:

That's right.

FRANK:

So, let's do some of that now. First of all, let's start out with Margaret Sanger. What were her essential beliefs as a person? What did she try and inflict on society?

SETH:

Yeah. So, they're kind of, I guess, like an unholy trinity of beliefs that Margaret Sanger held. And the shocking and scary thing, Frank, is that all of those ideas are the common, unholy trinity of beliefs, or ideologies, or worldviews of today's crazy, out of control culture of death, the Democrat party, most of our cowards in the republican party, and the broader culture, unfortunately. Margaret Sanger was a sexual theorist. She believed in sexual licentiousness, sexual libertinism, sexual freedom. There is a very damning line from her first publication. It was called 'Woman Rebel.'

There you go, Frank. And the mast, or the headline of that magazine, and we have the pictures of all this in the documentary, by the way, was 'No Gods, No Masters.' And that actually captures two of these aspects of the unholy trinity of her beliefs, one of which is Christianity is

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evil. Christians are horrible. I hate God. Also, God doesn't exist, but I really hate him. And so, we need to replace the old Christendom with something bright and new, with something fresh and new. But really, it's just neo-pagan revivalism. And in that first article, in her first publication, before the founding of Planned Parenthood, Frank, Margaret Sanger said, our ultimate objective is unlimited sexual gratification without the burden of unwanted children. Oh, whoa, whoa. Does that phrase not represent the entire culture of death today and the entire--

FRANK:

Say that again. Say that again.

SETH:

That's right. Margaret Sanger's first article, our ultimate objective is unlimited sexual gratification without the burden of unwanted children. In fact, one of her magazines, The Birth Control Review, showed a woman with a weight attached to her ankle via a chain. And the weight said, unwanted babies. The women are being burdened by these horrible things called children.

So, basically, can I say this on this show? I think we said PG-13. These people wanted orgasms without responsibility. If it feels good, do it. And I want to live however I want, but I just don't want to take responsibility for my sexual choices. She puts that line in her first magazine publication, before the founding of Planned Parenthood. The second sort of aspect of her belief is that some people are good, and some people are bad. So, this is eugenics, right? Okay.

And by the way, eugenics is alive and well today. Let me give one example, because I know we're short on time. You think it's a coincidence, Christian, that Planned Parenthood is now the second largest provider of chemically castrating drugs for America's gender confused youth? That's not a coincidence, because one of the aspects of the eugenics movement in the early 20th century, the American Eugenics Society, by the way, all of Margaret Sanger's best friends, board members, and financiers were eugenicists or were part of the American Eugenics Society, is the belief that we should sterilize people.

And we need to sterilize people, they believe, Frank, because of the overpopulation, too many people on planet Earth. So, they were the first, Bill Gates and Klaus Schwabs, but also specific

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groups of people that we don't like. So, they called it certain races, the poor. They really had it out for the mentally and physically disabled. And then, like, people with a history of criminal behavior and alcoholism. They're really bad citizens. And so, we actually need to sterilize them. They shouldn't be allowed to have kids. And Margaret Sanger supported the Buck versus Bell Supreme Court decision of 1927, which allowed the state to mandate the sterilization of those considered a threat to the gene pool. Yes, that happened in America, y'all.

So, she was a eugenicist. She said things like eugenics without birth control seems to me, said Sanger, a house built upon the sands. It is at the mercy of the rising streams of the unfit. Oh, yikes. So, she said, I'm trying to build this house called eugenics. And she's using a biblical metaphor. You see that, Frank? The house built on sand and the house built on the rock, but I'm doing it without birth control. And she coined the term birth control.

So, she said, we need to build this house called eugenics on the rock solid foundation of birth control to stop the unfit from reproducing. So, that's the second aspect of what this demon believed, who was demonically inspired, that there are the fit and the unfit. And so, her board member that helped her found Planned Parenthood in 1921, Frank, here's a little Easter egg from the book that's going to rip your face off. His name was Lothrop Stoddard. He was a high official of the Massachusetts KKK.

He was actually their grand wizard. And he wrote a book called 'The Revolt Against Civilization: The Menace of the Underman.' Ooh, who's the underman? And why are they a menace? Right. The unfit. He believed the unfit were a menace, and they're the underman. So, they're the untermenschen. And so, the Nazi party's chief racial theorist, this gets gnarly. Nobody knows this stuff.

Alfred Rosenberg appropriated the German term untermenschen, meaning subhuman, to refer to the Jews, Frank. And the title of Heinrich Himmler's famous Nazi propaganda book, when Lothrop Stoddard's book, 'The Menace of the Underman' was translated into German, underman was translated as untermenschen.

Y'all listen to me. I have the copy of this book. It was \$350 online, and it was the only one I could find available in the world. It's the German translated edition of Margaret Sanger's

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founding board member's, the KKK guy, his book. That word untermenschen, to refer to the Jews, did not appear until the German translated edition of Margaret Sanger's board member's book, 'The Menace of the Underman.' Christian, you just heard me correctly. The Nazis got the term subhuman from Margaret Sanger's board member's book, who was the grand wizard of the Massachusetts KKK chapter. Okay?

So, these people believe that there were the fit and the unfit. So, that's the second aspect of sort of Sanger's very demonic, unholy trinity of beliefs. And the last aspect is that we need to replace the old Christendom and Christianity with something fresh and new. But there's nothing progressive about progressivism.

All of their ideas are regressive. And Margaret Sanger has taken us back not into a shining gilded age of freedom, but back to when cultures slept with whoever they wanted, destroyed the rights of children, and killed babies. Nothing we're experiencing today in America is progressive.

FRANK:

And then Sanger put her clinics in minority neighborhoods.

SETH:

That's right.

FRANK:

To eradicate the minorities that she did not want to procreate.

SETH:

And, guys, Frank is not a conspiracy theorist. Here, I memorized all this stuff for you guys because it's such a wicked history. It's hard to believe it's true. So, I'm bringing it to you today, believer in the hopes that you'll wake up. She launched the Negro Project in 1939. And here was the opening line of the proposal of the Negro Project, a project of the American Birth Control League, later renamed Planned Parenthood.

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She said the massive negroes, particularly in the south, are still breeding carelessly and disastrously, with the result that the increase among Negroes, even more than among whites, is from that portion of the population, least intelligent and fit. Oh, there's that word again, Frank - fit. So, yes, the founder of Planned Parenthood said the massive negroes are reproducing too much, and that's really bad. And so, she hired regional coordinators to push forward the Negro Project in black enclaves, not just in New York, but around the country, Frank.

And one of her Negro project directors, isn't it good that we have all these citations? We can air all their dirty laundry. One of her Negro Project directors said this. There is a great danger that we will fail because the Negroes think that this is a plan for their extermination. Hence, let's appear to let the colored run it. Whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa. End quote. What? Yeah. One of the people on Planned Parenthood's payroll when she launched the Negro Project said, the black people think that this is a plan. Like, we're trying to eradicate them. So, this is dangerous for our agenda.

So, let's let those black people, Frank, think they run the Negro Project and are actually in charge of said Negro Project. And that's why today, brother, if you walk into a Planned Parenthood clinic in a majority black enclave where they put 79% of their surgical abortion facilities, you will not be greeted by a young white clerk at the front desk. You will be met by a black young lady at the front desk of that abortion clinic. So, the black mothers whose black unborn baby's Planned Parenthood has assigned dollar signs to, will feel more comfortable when she sees someone who looks like them. The entire operation was a ruse.

FRANK:

Ladies and gentlemen, this episode might just be too true for you, isn't it? You're going, oh, this is shocking. What can I do? We're going to talk about it right after the break. You're listening to I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist. My guest, Seth Gruber. Much more in a minute.

If you're shocked, I was when I first heard about this from Seth's book, 'The 1916 Project.' You need to go to the1916project.com and we're going to go back to Seth here in just a moment. It's very important in this election year to talk about abortion in the right way, and we are doing it today with Seth Gruber. And, Seth, I've got to, I got to say, it was everything you said in the last segment.

I was shocked the first time I heard it, but I was even more shocked to hear about the connection. And you've talked about this when we were together at Alan Jackson's church in Murfreesboro a month or two ago. There's actually a connection between RU 486, which is the abortion pill, and Zyklon B, which is the chemical that was used by the Nazis to kill the Jews in the gas chambers. Explain.

SETH:

Yeah, this is the kind of stuff, brother, that if, again, if I had said this and if my book had come out in 2016, I don't think there would have been a market in the evangelical church for it, actually, Frank. I think it's post 2020 when a lot of Christians realize how much they have been lied to by their political betters and journalistic betters who realize the corruption in our country, that now they're willing to hear answers that I think ten years ago, Christians would have said, you watch too much Alex Jones. And now they hear these answers, and they're like, you know what? I bet that's true.

My book is 175 pages with 230 references and citations to prove everything that I want to say. And you can prove it, too, Christian. In 1916, there was another company that was founded, and I don't think it's a coincidence that all that evil came out of the year 1916. What am I talking

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about? The abortion pill in America, Frank, is called RU 486, okay? That's the technical name, RU 486. Planned Parenthood's new numbers, 2023?

Sixty-three percent of the babies killed in 2023 were killed through the abortion pill, 63%. The 630,000 precious little babies, Frank, were not killed through surgeries, forceps, or vacuums. They were killed by a medication abortion pill as women sat on the toilet and dumped their children into the American sewage system, okay? Which has risen, like, over 40% than what it was ten years ago. This abortion pill, it refers to Roussel-Uclaf, that's the R and the U. Roussel-Uclaf, a French pharmaceutical company that created the abortion pill. Wait a second, who was their majority shareholder?

Roussel-Uclaf's majority shareholder was Hoechst AG, a German chemical company. And in 1916, Hoechst AG co-founded another German chemical company known as IG Farben. IG Farben would become the manufacturer of a cyanide gas known as Zyklon B, the gas used to poison Jews in Nazi death camps. So, Hoechst AG simply shifted from creating poison to murder Jews to creating poison to murder babies. If you think that's a coincidence, I have a bridge to sell you in Brooklyn.

FRANK:

Meanwhile, I saw an article this week about how some governors, particularly the governor up there in Washington state. What's his name? Jay Inslee? Yeah. He wants to stockpile RU 486 because it's a right to have a dead baby, apparently, in Washington state. You know, if Trump gets in and somehow restricts this, of course Trump, he doesn't have the power to restrict this even if he wanted to.

But it just goes to show you, how did we go from I want abortion to be safe, legal, and rare, to we now are using abortion as some sort of sacrament that people on the left have created, that we must have abortion, that we must kill children? We want to invite you to our state so we can pay for it. How did this happen, Seth?

SETH:

Yeah, you're going to learn more in this book than maybe you've ever learned before. But what has happened is, Frank, they simply did what they told us they were going to do. Okay. The

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cultural revolutionaries and Marxists of the 20th century were very clear, actually, Frank, about what their goals were and what they wanted to do. They have taken our strategy, brother, and they flipped it upside down. Create disciples, go to the very ends of the earth, teaching them to obey all that I've commanded you.

They have done that better for secularism, neo-Malthusianism, Darwinism, no gods, no masters, I can do whatever I want, than we have done in the last hundred years or so for pure and undefiled religion. Antonio Gramsci, the modern father of critical theory and cultural Marxism, Frank, had a phrase called the strategy of the robes. And what he meant was, he said, the riots in the street, chaz chop in Seattle, police free zones. This stuff isn't working to usher in the revolution. So, maybe we need to approach it culturally.

Let's control the robes of the academy, the robes of the clergy, the robes of the courts, the robes of the scientific institutions, and then we can take over the culture from that perspective, okay? Antonio Gramsci, who goes afoul of Mussolini and spends the rest of his life in prison writing his prison letters that become the basis for the founding of the Frankfurt School in Germany, that becomes all of the critical theory, Marxist teachings that American leftists have absorbed today.

And then a man recently, a few years ago, translated Antonio Gramsci's prison letters into English for American leftists, okay? His name is Joseph Buttigieg. He's the worldwide expert on Antonio Gramsci and brings his letters to English, to American leftists and crazy kooky communists at our universities. Well, he's the father of a certain mayor, Pete Buttigieg. And they have taken our strategy to go everywhere, everywhere to the very ends of the earth, and they have flipped it upside down, and they have used that better to upend the culture, to create a culture of death than the blood bought bride of Christ has done to create a culture of life and give God a reason to show America mercy.

You're going to learn some shocking connections, mind-blowing truth bombs in this book that you probably have not heard anywhere else because I went full homeschool, ADHD, nerd level research for this book for you, church, because God tells his people in Hosea 4:6, Frank, my people are being destroyed for lack of knowledge. It's happening now, actively. You are being destroyed.

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So, why did I say at the beginning of your program that the best way I found in the last three years to shake Christians out of their reverie, to get them to are, to say, what can I do? Is to teach the history of demonic principalities that masqueraded as just the politics to recognize this was false religion the entire time. Why? Because the Bible says that.

If we're being destroyed for lack of knowledge, then we need to seek knowledge and understanding on how this culture was created. So, we at the White Rose Resistance, the fastest growing pro-life organization in America, Frank, are just trying to put ourselves out of a job, bro, to get the church back in the business of doing what she should have been doing all along.

FRANK:

By the way, we didn't have time to do this. I don't know, Seth, if you can hang out for another 20-25 minutes and tell us about what the White Rose Resistance really is, because we've run out of time here. We'll do it in another podcast. But it actually goes back to Nazi Germany and a resistance, a couple of people that wanted to resist Hitler. That's where the story comes from, and we need to tell you about it.

So, friends, we'll do it on a future podcast. But before we do, Seth, people can go to the1916project.com, not the 1619, the1916project.com/book. Get the book. Also get the video and get it in your church. But what else can people do? People are probably shocked and frustrated right now, Seth. Throw them a lifeline. Here's what you can do to fight back against this and do something for God here.

SETH:

Amen. That's right. Yeah. So, at the White Rose Resistance, we really exist to equip and mobilize the church to take action. I don't want to be doing this in ten years, Frank. I want to be rebuilding Christendom with you, not tearing down another high place. And so, we really do a lot to equip and mobilize the Church. So, we launched a White Rose Resistance chapter in Boise. We're launching in southern California this summer. We're launching in Denver this summer, and we're launching in Dallas Fort Worth this fall. We would love to launch where you live as well, brother and sister, listening to this. Listen, you can take action all by yourself.

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Go to school board meetings, okay? Know who your elected representatives are. Try to get godly men and women elected. Sidewalk counsel outside of abortion centers and plead for the life of the baby. Launch a ministry at your church, a civic engagement, a salt and light ministry. But we exist to make sure that you're educated and equipped and mobilized to be able to contend in this culture of death to turn things around before it's too late. So, if you go to TheWhiteRose.life, you can join us, the fastest growing pro-life organization in America, to get equipped.

This is not the role of another 501(c)(3). I'm simply doing what the Church used to do in America. Because unless the Church flatulent becomes the Church militant, it will become the Church irrelevant.

FRANK:

That's right. And when you say militant, you don't mean taking up arms, just getting out there and presenting the truth in a way that people can understand. Thanks so much. Go to the1916project.com. God bless. See you here next week.

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
